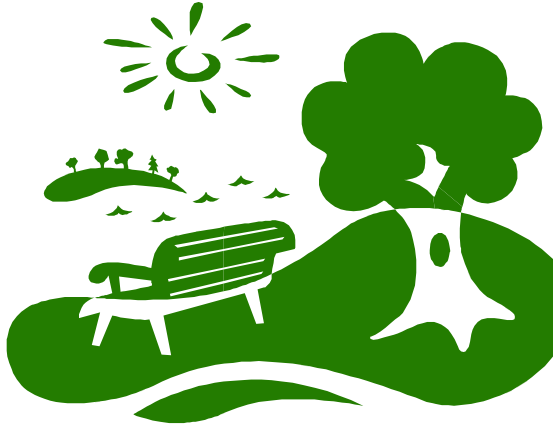

## CURBSIDE RECYCLING

There is some good news about curbside recycling! Recently the City requested bids from garbage haulers and the results of those bids are back, they appear to be very positive! Our next step is to award the winning contract at our August 6<sup>th</sup> City Council Meeting. The Mayor and Council will discuss the results of the bids and award the winning contractor with the contract to haul the city's recyclable materials. An open house will also be scheduled which will allow for residents to come in and ask questions about the recycling program and learn how the program will be implemented. In addition, the City will be mailing out information explaining the recycling program and outlining the cost associated with a curbside recycling program.

**MUNICIPAL CAUCUS MEETING**

A Nomination Meeting for our municipal caucuses will be held on **Tuesday, August 13, 2013 at 7:00 p.m.** at the Fruit Heights City Office, 910 S. Mountain Rd.

Up for election is position of Mayor and two City Council Members (all 4-year terms). *To be eligible to run for office in Fruit Heights, you must be a registered voter and reside in the city for a minimum of one year.*

### Watering Lawns...

Remember – **PLEASE** do not water your lawns for several days after it has rained – turn your timers off. Watering is prohibited from 10a – 6p. **PLEASE CONSERVE AND REDUCE USAGE BY 20%.** Weber Basin Water Conservancy District has moved up the date to October 1st (formerly Oct. 15<sup>th</sup>) for water to be turned off for the winter due to water restrictions. Therefore this will include Haight's Creek, Benchland, and Fruit Heights Special Improvement District (SID) Irrigation.

### RATE INCREASES IN THE FORECAST



In November of 2009, a water base rate schedule was adopted for 2010 through 2015. The next water base increase is effective July 1<sup>st</sup> for 2013-14 and will be \$29.50 per month, a price increase of \$2.50. Also a storm drain fee increase is effective July 1 to \$11.75 an increase of \$1.40. The city bills in arrears; therefore you will see the increases one month after the effective date.

### 2013 UNSUNG HEROES Dick and Lonna Brown

Dick and Lonna Brown are Fruit Heights City's 2013 Unsung Heroes! **CONGRATULATIONS!!!** They have been so willing to share their great artistic talent with Fruit Heights City and everyone they come in contact with. Dick worked as a commercial artist with Thomas Arts in Farmington. During his career he earned 7 Obie awards. An Obie is the equivalent of a Cleo but for print advertising. Dick designed the Fruit Heights City flag and logo.

Dick and Lonna designed and painted the Fruit Heights buffalo during the Olympic Games in 2002. Lonna painted the lettering on the Castle Heights playground, and has spruced it up several times since. Dick was the official calligrapher for the 2002 Olympic winter games. He CALL-i-graphed the award certificates for all the Olympic medalists.

Lonna, with Becky Macfarlane, built 8-foot models of the Olympic mascots for the official introduction of those mascots and then designed the 16" versions of those same mascots.

Lonna has been a stay-at-home mom, but always willing to share her fine artistic talent. She has painted large murals at Burton, Kaysville, and Creekside Elementary Schools along with 14 other local elementary schools in Davis and Weber County over a number of years.

Dick is musically gifted, as a young man he was selected to tour the U.S. with a musical troupe known as the Young Americans. They toured with Johnny

Mathis and Judy Garland. He always shares his talents in the community - ask him to share his signature song "Buffalo Boy"!

Dick and Lonna are blessed with 4 wonderful children. They are wonderful grandparents.
