Sandra Servoss Berger was recently selected as Fruit Heights Mother of the Year for 2014. This awesome Award was presented just before Mother's Day in the presence of honorees from eleven other cities in Davis

County. Sandy and Bill live in the Hidden Springs Subdivision near our city offices.

Sandy spent her growing up years in Bountiful attending Stoker School, South Davis Jr. High, and then was part of the first graduating class of the new Bountiful High in 1957. She met her sweetheart Dr. William F. Berger at Utah State and completed her junior year there. After marrying Bill they moved to Chicago, where he graduated from Northwestern Dental School and then made their home in Southern California where Bill practiced Dentistry for 41 years until retirement gave them the opportunity to move to our beautiful city. Sandy completed her Bachelor's Degree at Cal State Fullerton when 60 years old!

Parents of eight children (and 20 grandchildren by the end of May), Sandy and Bill are firm in their belief that if children want to be really happy they must learn to be obedient, both in keeping family rules and in being true to their faith. There was also one memorable year when she was preparing 6 sack-lunches every morning for the kids to take to school! Luckily, we forget how hard it was to get everyone to ball practices, piano lessons, school and

church events but doing so brought great rewards. The Berger's had their share of "garage bands", teenage parties, road trips (twice a year to Utah's ski slopes) and sporting events but know that "families who play together stay together"! Sandy has learned that more can be accomplished in the home showing plenty of love to family members than any other way. Now quilting, indexing and interacting with their grandchildren take up most of her time. We give many thanks to our friends and relatives who make life so enjoyable here in Davis County.
