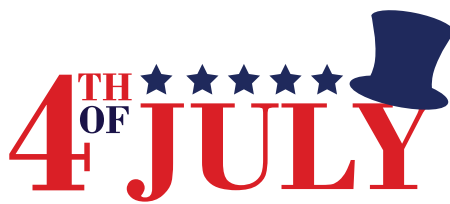

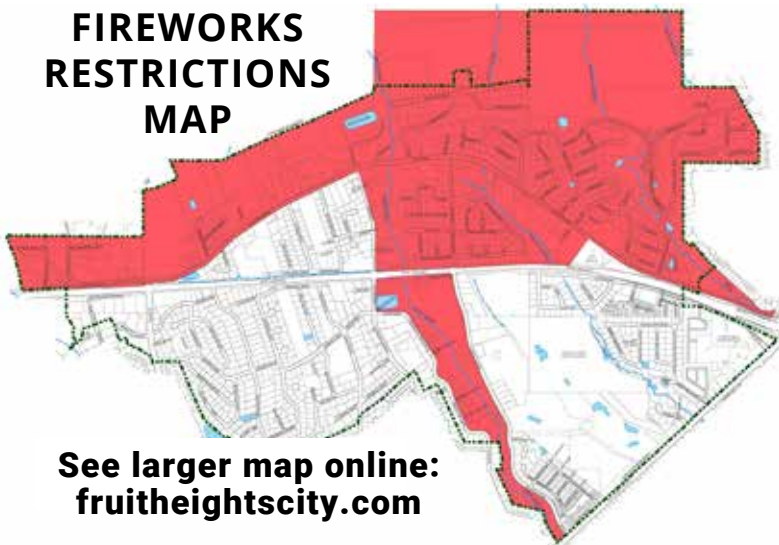

Because of Fruit Heights' location, much of our city is surrounded by thick vegetation. Due to the drought, much of that vegetation is drier than usual, causing extreme fire dangers in our area.

These dangers create the need for restrictions regarding open fires and fireworks in our city. Only a limited number of areas allow for the discharging of fireworks within Fruit Heights. Authorities are extremely concerned and are taking every precaution to prevent a wildfire. The Davis County Sheriff's Office will be patrolling and responding to violations.

Open burning is NOT ALLOWED unless land is zoned for agricultural use. **See the Open Burn and Fireworks Restrictions map at www.fruitheightscity.com.**



DON'T MISS OUT: SMART CONTROLLER AVAILABILITY ENDING SOON - JUNE 15



A Smart Sprinkler Controller is like a smart thermostat for your lawn and garden. The controller connects to local weather stations, auto-adjusting to weather and soil conditions, making it easier for you to maintain a healthy lawn while cutting water use.

Fruit Heights City has Hydro-Rain Smart Irrigation Controllers available for purchase for \$20 (retail \$178). Residents complete a short sign-up form online, and then pay \$20 when picking up the controller at City Hall, 910 S. Mountain Road.

Fruit Heights City is following the request of Utah's governor, and conserving water at City locations as Utah faces extreme drought situations.

Look for these signs, reminding everyone that Fruit Heights is watering less at this time.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

UDOT's US-89 project still has a long way to go, but some major events will be happening this summer. These steps will have a large impact on Fruit Heights residents. Learn more at www.udot.utah.gov/us89.

400 North: The interchange at 200 N./400 N. is nearing completion. An operational opening is planned for mid-July, meaning work will continue in the area, but the interchange will open to traffic. UDOT crews are currently working to complete underground utility installation in the area.

Nicholls Road: When the 200 N./400 N. interchange opens, Nicholls Rd. will close for approximately 24 months while UDOT crews work to install a crossing at US-89. Traffic on US-89 will shift as crews work on the Nicholls Rd. portion of the project. Residents should expect continued detours and interruptions in service as the underground utilities are relocated.

Mill & Overlay Work: Starting in July, Fruit Heights City will be doing mill and overlay road projects in the city. This is a maintenance technique that removes the top 2" layer of the street, then a new layer is put in place. Look for more information at www.fruitheightscity.com.
